Dr. Nikolai Gil D. Reyes is a PhD student at the Institute of Medical Science and an incoming fellow at the Dalglish Family 22q Clinic. He finished his movement disorders clinical fellowship at the Edmond J. Safra Program in Parkinson's Disease and the Morton and Gloria Shulman Movement Disorders Clinic at Toronto Western Hospital. He is a recipient of the 2023-2025 Parkinson Canada Clinical Research Fellowship Award, the 2024 Brain and Behavior Research Foundation (BBRF) Young Investigator Grant, a 2025-2026 Ontario Graduate Scholarship (OGS), and a 2025 Brain Canada Next Gen Award in Parkinson's Disease Research.

Working with both the Dalglish Family 22q Clinic and the TWH Movement Disorders team, Dr. Reyes is involved in providing clinical care for patients with 22q11.2 deletion syndrome (22q11.2DS) who have movement disorders. His research interests include Parkinson's Disease (PD) and other parkinsonian syndromes, genetically-mediated movement disorders, and leveraging genetic data for improved diagnosis of movement disorders. His current work aims to investigate potential risk modifiers and diagnostic tools for parkinsonism related and unrelated to antipsychotic treatment using 22q11.2 microdeletion as a high-risk model.
